Word of the Day

smite verb | SMYTE

Definition:

Smite means "to hit someone or something very hard." Other uses of the word include "to severely injure, kill, or attack someone" (as in "smitten by disease") and "to captivate or take" (as in "smitten by her beauty").

Did You Know?

Today's word has been part of the English language for a very long time; its earliest uses date to before the 12th century. Smite can be traced back to the Old English smītan, meaning "to smear (a substance) on something" or "to stain or defile." Smite kept these meanings for a few centuries before they became obsolete and others arose or became more prominent, among them the modern "to strike or attack." But smite also has a softer side. As of the mid-17th century, it can mean "to captivate or take"–a sense that is frequently used in the past participle in such contexts as "smitten by their beauty" or "smitten with them" (meaning "in love with them"). If such a shift seems surprising, just remember what they say about the moon hitting your eye like a big pizza pie (that's a smiting).

Tech Time & Digital Literacy - Are you scam aware?

As part of Scams Awareness Week 2023, the Ravensthorpe CRC held a special Tech Time and Digital Literacy session, to help raise awareness of the threats of scams. On Monday November 27th, a group of seven eager community members attended to learn how to protect themselves and their loved ones from scammers.

With the spotlight on Impersonation Scams, participants learnt how to spot and avoid scams both online and on a mobile device. Sharing a cuppa was a great accompaniment to the Scams Awareness Week presentation, which highlighted the common signs of a scam and the next steps to take after you have identified a scam. Each participant left with valuable knowledge of how to stay safe online.

What is an Impersonation Scam?

Impersonation Scams are where scammers assume the identities of reputable businesses, friends or even family to steal your personal information or money.

What are the key signs of Impersonation Scams?

- You receive a message that asks you to click on a link.
- You are asked to provide

personal details or money urgently.

• An organisation that you think is real, tells you there has been an unauthorised transaction or asks you to confirm a payment that you didn't make.

• You're contacted by someone saying they are from a government department or law enforcement, and they threaten you.

• A sale, investment or job offer looks too good to be true.

BAITING TO PROTECT

NATIVE WILDLIFE

Under the Parks and Wildlife Service's *Western Shield* program, baiting to control foxes and feral cats occurs on more than three million hectares of conservation lands in Western Australia.

The baits used are toxic to introduced animals but not to native animals which have an evolved tolerance to the active compound (1080). All baited areas are signposted.

Baiting occurs on a regular and ongoing basis to protect endangered native animals including the numbat, western ground parrot and western swamp tortoise.



Attention pet owners: these baits will kill domestic dogs and cats. Baited areas must be considered dangerous for pet dogs and cats at all times.

BUSHFIRE IN THE FITZ

As many readers will be aware, the Fitzgerald River National Park faced a bushfire sparked by a lightning strike on Tuesday 28 November 2023.

Managed by the Department of Biodiversity Conservation & Attractions (DBCA), the response to the threat showcased the effectiveness of coordinated efforts between various agencies and the local community.

DBCA, in partnership with the Department of Fire & Emergency Services (DFES), the Shire of Ravensthorpe, and community volunteers, quickly mobilised resources. And once again Hopetoun became the assembly point for DBCA's experienced firefighting teams, who came from all over the state to protect the park.



The fire burnt approximately 3000 hectares and one of the key factors driving the teams to so promptly contain and control the fire, were the terrible weather conditions forecast for the Saturday.

Thankfully, the fire was under control by then and with more favourable weather forecast for the week ahead, DBCA have started to demobilise at the time of writing.

Posties feel the bite of rising dog attacks

More than 50 postal workers are falling victim to dog-related incidents each week, prompting calls for dog owners to secure their pets and help keep Posties safe.

Australia Post has seen a spike in dog-related incidents, with an average of 7.5 recorded each day since July this year. With the busiest time of year approaching, Australia Post is making a plea for dog owners to take action to help protect their Postie.

The sharp rise in dog-related incidents was most pronounced in Queensland and New South Wales, as illustrated in the state-by-state breakdown:

- 321 in Queensland
- 306 in New South Wales
- 177 in Western Australia
- 103 in Victoria
- 68 in South Australia
- 9 in the Northern Territory
- 5 in Tasmania


Despite ongoing public awareness campaigns from Australia Post, the frequency of dog related incidents has not decreased. Rod Maule, Australia Post General Manager Safety and Wellbeing, emphasised the simple steps dog owners can take to keep posties safe.

"Our team of Posties are working hard delivering to our customers in all parts of the nation, however we need the support of dog owners to keep their dog secure and our Posties safe.

"We see a lot of incidents occur at the front door as our Posties try to deliver packages, with dogs racing out from behind their owners. It takes just a second to secure your dog in another room, and it makes the world of difference to our team members.

"This is our busiest time of year, in fact in all metro capitals and some regional cities and towns we are now delivering up to seven days a week so it's more important than ever to keep dogs secure. We know our customers are eager to get their deliveries however our team's safety comes first, if it's not safe for our Posties to approach a home, then they won't be able to deliver." Mr Maule concluded.

Australia Post data identified the following areas as having the highest number of dog related incidents nationally:

- 1. Darra, Qld
- 2. Alexandria, NSW
- 3. Nepean, NSW
- 4. Tamworth (New England), NSW
- 5. Rockingham, WA
- 6. Stafford, Qld

To help protect its team members Australia Post has introduced several preventative measures aimed at reducing the number of dog-related incidents.

In addition to on-the-job training Posties are also provided with a digital hazard tracker that allows them to log the location of a hazardous dog. The next time they, or any other postie, approach a pre- logged location they will receive a warning notification on their device, allowing them to avoid it or take extra care.

Australia Post has also re-introduced a postmark featuring a message to 'secure your dog for safe delivery'. The postmark will be stamped on envelopes processed through our letter facilities in Victoria, New South Wales, Western Australia and Queensland* in a bid to remind residents of the importance of securing their dog.

Dr Tracey Henderson, Animal Behaviour Veterinarian, Director Dog Bite Prevention Project said, "Christmas is a time people's front gates and front doors become busier with deliveries, service providers doing last minute maintenance, and the arrival of guests.

"For many dogs these environmental changes generate heightened feelings of fear, anxiety and stress. When cortisol levels are elevated dogs find it hard to regulate their response to things that threaten or frighten them, which in turn can result in an increased risk of aggression, bites and attacks.

"Even dogs that are ordinarily calm, friendly or welcoming can show uncharacteristically protective or aggressive behaviours when experiencing prolonged periods of stress. At this time of the year, I encourage people entering properties where there are both known and unknown dogs, to take additional care and be mindful of early warning signs that a dog might be fearful, anxious, or stressed which could pose a greater risk of a bite or attack."

TOP TIPS FOR KEEPING DOGS SECURE:

- Always keep front gates securely closed.
- Where possible, secure dogs in the back garden (rather than the front) and keep any side gates securely closed.

• If you are expecting a delivery, be careful when opening your front door to ensure your dog doesn't run out from behind you. Keeping them safely in another room when you answer the door is a great way to prevent this.

Earlier this year Australia Post formed a Dog Safety Taskforce together with other companies who face similar challenges when delivering to or entering a property. The taskforce includes companies like Uber, Ergon Energy, Energex and SA Power Networks with each business sharing insights on the impact of dog related incidents within their own workforce and possible strategies to help reduce the number of incidents moving forward.

Variety selection key to controlling spot form net blotch (SFNB) in low-rainfall barley

GRDC

Selecting the right variety can significantly reduce the impact of spot form net blotch (SFNB) and optimise economic returns in the barley intensive cropping systems prevalent in Western Australia's low-rainfall zone (LRZ).

This is one of the key findings from data collected by Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, Western Australia (DPIRD) plant pathologists working on a five-year GRDC investment, Management of spot form of net blotch in the low-rainfall zones of Western Australia.

With new varieties offering improved yield potential and useful disease resistance, barley growers are encouraged to update their variety choice for 2024 to reduce disease risk.

Spot form net blotch

SFNB is an important disease of barley across all cropping regions of WA. It is caused by the fungal pathogen Pyrenophora teres f. maculata, which survives on infected stubble.



Research in the Western Australian LRZ has shown variety choice can play a key role in controlling spot form net blotch in high barley rotations. Photo: DPIRD

In the LRZ, barley-on-barley rotations and high inoculum loads on barley stubble from previous seasons create favourable conditions for infection. Susceptible barley varieties, early sowing, mild temperatures (15-25 degrees Celsius) and regular leaf wetness can also encourage disease outbreaks. DPIRD's 2024 Western Australian Crop Sowing Guide provides upto-date information on several new barley varieties, including their SFNB resistance ratings, yield potential and suitability for conditions in the LRZ, for growers to consider.

Lack of access to contraception is a form of violence against women

On the eve of the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women (November 25), Sustainable Population Australia (SPA) claims that denying women access to contraception is a form of violence.

SPA national president Jenny Goldie says women and adolescent girls must have the right to decide if or when they have sex, and if and when to have children.

"To deny women and adolescent girls that right is coercion; a form of violence," says Ms Goldie.

"Delaying pregnancy enables adolescents to remain in school to pursue further education. It can lead to work that empowers them socially and economically. "Contraception reduces not just unwanted pregnancies but also death from unsafe abortion and maternal deaths in childbirth.

"Women and adolescent girls are denied access to modern contraception in a number of ways including: limited choice of methods and services; cultural or religious opposition; and gender-based barriers to accessing services."

According to a study published in The Lancet last year, 160 million women worldwide had unmet contraception needs in 2019, despite significant progress in the use of modern contraceptives globally over the previous 50 years.

"This study also revealed that more than half the

women with unmet need for contraception live in sub-Saharan Africa and South Asia," says Ms Goldie.

"It also found that younger women had the highest levels of unmet need, despite being the group for whom the economic and social benefits of contraceptive access are likely to be most substantial."

Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 3.7.1 target states: By 2030, ensure universal access to sexual and reproductive health-care services, including for family planning, information and education, and the integration of reproductive health into national strategies and programmes.

"SPA calls on the Minister for International Development and the Pacific, Pat Conroy MP, to better fund sexual and reproductive health services (SRH) in Australia's overseas development program to help ensure SDG 3.7.1 is realised."




